9. What changes and/or recommendations do you have for a future chairman?

When my mom called for the tickets she was informed that if we called earlier we could have gotten better seats. I recommend that next time, the chairperson call about two months early and give them an estimate number of seats needed (overestimate, it's okay with them). They will then hold the tickets for us until we can confirm the actual number needed. So the sooner you call, the better the seats. I also recommend that car-pooling options be set up

before the night of the event. There were a couple of people who ended up driving with just two people in a car and therefore had to foot the bill for parking on their own.

As far as both the goals are concerned, we exceeded on both. We had a total of 37 tickets bought with 36 people in attendance. There were six teen members in attendance (Brent Fabian, Brandon Fabian, Morgan Maldonado, Cody Muehlfelder, Mikayla Muehlfelder, and Brianna Muehlfelder) along with four teens who are not currently members. (The mother of two of them is an associate member and the other teens were friends of members.) We had twenty-seven adults present with nineteen of them members and eight guests.

Impact on chapter: This project was set out to offer the opportunity for our chapter to “bond.” I think it was successful in that matter because we were all able to have a great time together (especially when we got to boo the referee’s). I believe that we were all able to have fun, which is what we wanted to do. I feel this project opens the door for our chapter on other fun outings we can offer.

Impact on individual members: I think the people who came to the game were reminded in a subtle way that one of the reasons we all joined was to be able to hang out with friends. I think that was achieved on all different age levels. We all had a great time and look forward to going again in March, with our free tickets.

Impact on Community: There was no immediate effect on the community. But this type of project is a “behind-the-scenes” event that bonds our chapter and strengthens it. Because of this “inner strength” we are better able to serve our community. It was a “team-building” event that will only benefit our community in the way that we will be able to work together.
